

Contract of Employment

This contract is made on this 1st day of September in the year 1663 between Jacque Martin of New France (hereinafter referred to as the Employer) and Marie Bouchard of Normandy, France (hereinafter referred to as the Indentured Servant).

IT IS HEREBY AGREED as follows:

The Employer shall employ the Indentured Servant in accordance with the terms and conditions of this contract and subject to the provisions of the relevant laws, regulations, rules, policies and directives of New France.

This contract shall begin from the date of the arrival of the Indentured Servant at the Employer's home.


The Indentured Servant shall continue in the employment under the terms and conditions of this Contract for a period of 3 years or until such time the contract is terminated in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Contract. The Indentured Servant shall work and reside only at the home of Jacque Martin's during the duration of the contract. The Indentured Servant shall perform diligently, faithfully and sincerely all household duties assigned by the Employer.

The Employer shall provide the Indentured Servants reasonable lodging and sufficient daily meals. The Employer shall not require the Indentured Servant to work or be engaged in any activities other than those related to house hold duties but must be available at all times as required to perform household duties as assigned.

The Employer shall pay for all the expenses related to transportation costs from the Indentured Servant's home in Normandy, France to the place of employment.


